

## How to describe esophageal/gastric varices

Esophageal varix : Form, Location & Color, Red color sign, Bleeding sign, Mucosal change			
<b>Form</b> (Fs, Fm, Fl)	<b>Small</b>	straight or linear, minimally elevated venous distension	
	<b>Medium</b>	tortuous or beaded, occupying less than 1/3 of the lumen	
	<b>Large</b>	tumorous or markedly enlarged, occupying more than 1/3 of the lumen

<b>Red Color Sign</b> (RCS0-3)	RCS0	absent

Bleeding sign	During bleeding	spurting or oozing	
	After hemostasis	red plug or white plug	
Mucosal change	Ulcer	post EVL ulcer	
	Scar	post EVL scar

<b>Location</b>	<b>GOV1</b>	continuation of esophageal varices and extend for 2 to 5 cm below the GE junction along the LC side of the stomach	<p style="font-size: small;">Gastro Esophageal Varices (GOV) GOV1      GOV2 Isolated Gastric Varices (IGV) IGV1      IGV2</p>
	<b>GOV2</b>	continuation of esophageal varices and extend into the fundus	
	<b>IGV</b>	isolated gastric varices located in the fundus	
	<b>IGV2</b>	isolated ectopic varices anywhere in the stomach	
<b>Size</b>	<b>Small</b>	less than 10mm	
	<b>Medium</b>	10-20mm	
	<b>Large</b>	greater than 20mm

Portal hypertensive gastropathy: Mucosal characteristics, Location			
<b>Mucosal characteristics</b>	<b>Mild</b>	snakeskin mosaic pattern appearance without hyperemia	
	<b>Severe</b>	snakeskin mosaic pattern appearance with flat/bulging red marks or black-brown spots	
<b>Location</b>	Text 예 description: fundus and upper body or whole stomach Example) Snakeskin mosaic pattern appearance without hyperemia was seen on the fundus and upper body of the stomach.
